Hello Parents and Guardians,

We are excited to have your child attending BCA or WPS for the 2021-2022 School Year! Below is some important information regarding WA state immunization regulations. We wanted to give you this information early so that you have plenty of time to prepare your child's immunization records.

According to Washington State Department of Health, all immunization records turned in to schools are required to be medically verified. **Immunization records must be turned into the school on or before the first day of attendance.** All BCA/WPS students should have a current Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) form on file. You can submit these forms by either attaching them to an email or submitting a hard copy to the front office.

- **Option 1:** Print your child's CIS from [MyIR](#). Go to <https://wa.myir.net/register> to begin the sign-up process.
- **Option 2:** A completed [Certificate of Immunization Status \(CIS\)](#) signed by a health care provider. Find the CIS form by visiting <https://www.doh.wa.gov/SCCI> and clicking on "Certificate of Immunization Status."
- **Option 3:** A CIS filled out by a parent/guardian with medical records attached. These records should be stamped or signed by you child's health care provider.
- **Option 4:** A CIS printed by a health care provider or school from the Washington State Immunization Information System.

***Washington State Department of Health has not updated the requirements for school immunization regarding the Covid 19 vaccination. If we receive any guidance on this matter, we will be sure to communicate with BCA/WPS families.**

Attached you will find the lists of required vaccinations by age and grade. If you are requesting an exemption from one or more of the immunization requirements, you must provide the school a completed Certificate of Exemption.

Children must meet minimum vaccine intervals and ages to be in compliance. Please talk to your health care provider or child care/preschool if you have questions. Instructions: To see which vaccines are required for school, find your child’s grade in the first column. Look at the matching row across the page to find the amount of vaccines required for your child to enter school.

* Vaccine Doses may be fewer than listed depending on your child’s situation.

Additional Information: Students must get vaccine doses at the correct timeframes to be in compliance with school requirements. Talk to your health care provider or school staff if you have questions about school immunization requirements.
